### **'A Fusion Primer - Part 1' by Phil (G6DLJ)**



Phil gave an excellent talk explaining the wonders of the Yaesu Fusion system which uses C4FM as its modulation system and Wires X as its Network.

The difference between Gateways which are Simplex and Repeaters which are Half Duplex was

explained together with the concept of Rooms. There were several interesting questions from members which Phil took time to fully answer.
