

EOSL ACCOUNTS by Terry (G4CHD)

QSLs are like Marmite – love them or hate them! However many of us have used the electronic version – eqsls – for many years and I believed I knew all there was to know about using them.

However when recently checking eqsls for the Club call GQ2FKO, I realised that like so many things in life these days I still have lots to learn!!

When an account is set up with EQSL, a Primary account is produced eg GX2FKO for which the operating time span must be specified, a Password and QTH Nickname chosen and finally the operating locator (eg IO71vb) given. You can then design an eqsl card for that callsign etc. Thereafter you can add further accounts which are attached to the Primary account eg GQ2FKO for which a different locator (IO71va) was adopted as well as a different eqsl card design.

You can use the same callsign more than once but the operating periods must NOT overlap. This is useful because back in May 2012 the Q prefix was also allowed ie I used

GQ4CHD in May 2012 and in June 2022 which EQSL allowed since the operational dates did not overlap. As many of you will know, the Club now uses the electronic Logger Log4OM which automatically uploads QSO details after each QSO. There is up to a 2 minute delay to allow for any editing/deleting which can be useful. Log4OM requires a Configuration specifying callsign, location etc and also the login details for eqsl. This requires callsign, password and QTH Nickname – all of which were correctly entered and on the surface all appeared to work smoothly.

However much later upon going into the EQSL website EQSL.CC and logging into GQ2FKO, I discovered many of the uploaded QSOs had a warning message relating to the specified 6 character locator. Since operation of GQ2FKO took place from both Victoria Park (IO71va) and Appledore Football Club (IO71vb), the locator setting in Log4OM was changed accordingly.

What I didn't realise until now is that to upload a QSO to an eqsl account (whether Primary or Attached) requires not only the correct EQSL account callsign, Password and QTH Nickname but ALSO the correct locator. This was the reason that some uploaded QSOs with the wrong locator were rejected.

It would therefore appear that to use a particular callsign from several locations, requires several EQSL accounts for this callsign – each having a non overlapping time frame.

This is my understanding of the situation and I will be only too happy for someone to correct me and explain things differently. There must be a simpler way of using eg a /P callsign with EQSL when used in several locations and it wouldn't be the first time that I have got hold of the wrong end of the stick!

That's it for this month - enjoy the Newsletter
