REPORT ON OUR MAY MEETING


This was a Natter Night and a chance to catch up over a cuppa. It's was also an opportunity to get advice/help problems you might have as other members are always eager to help.

Linking for beginners



GB7FB Bideford is a North Devon Repeater Group repeater hosted by Drew MØMFS

This document is for those who refuse to have their hobby defined by others

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Bideford DMR Repeater

MR is the only digital mode in regular use by Radio Amateurs able to interweave two separate channels through one repeater simultaneously. These channels are imaginatively named slot 1 and slot 2. Slot 1 is local RF to RF and slot 2 does exactly the same but ALSO lights up another 18 repeaters across the South West from Cornwall to Hampshire.


A QSO or even an impromptu net on slot 2 is all well and good but what if we wanted to run a regional net without tying up all 19 repeaters? Or perhaps we would want to pass emergency traffic across North Devon or maybe, well lots of maybe's.. You get the idea. Maybe you just want to chat to someone who only has D-Star or Fusion. Yes, that is possible too.


To keep this explanation simple we will link slot 1 of GB3ND Holsworthy to slot 1 of GB7FB in Bideford effectively forming a single super repeater with rock solid handheld coverage from East Cornwall to the beaches of Westward Ho and across to Braunton. In our example let's do it for the purposes of holding a regional digital net.

To make this a little more interesting, lets assume we have a friend who only has D-Star and we would like to include him in the regional digital net we are setting up.

Before we look at the technicalities of what we are attempting to do, lets look at an overview. We are going to link slot 1 of each repeater to a common talk group on FreeDMR using the keypad on our radio. Because they will then be using a common talk group they will be effectively linked together as one. To include our D-Star owning friend we will choose a talk group that has a bridge to the D-Star network. As it happens the talk group we are going to choose also has a bridge to YSF Fusion.

Here is a simple diagram of our new network and on the next page we will look at how we may achieve it.





Let's look at how we set up the network as per our diagram. Of course, in the same manner we could just use a single repeater to talk to our D-Star/Fusion owning friend shown above.

So, we are going to use private calls as commands to control each/or singular repeater(s). The button presses required vary from radio to radio so consult your radio handbook. It usually takes the form of 'Manual dial/private' call then press PTT briefly and await a reply from the repeater.

Set your radio to either GB3ND or GB7FB slot 1 as appropriate. It is, of course, good practice to make sure the repeater is not in use. Next make a private call to 5000. *Manual dial/private call, type 5000 on keyboard press PTT briefly*. The repeater should reply "Not connected".

If you get a connected message make a private call to 4000 in the same manner. The repeater will now reply "Disconnected"

Next make a private call to 2356 (2356 is chat 6 on the FreeDMR network). If you just want to talk to your D-Star owning friend they should connect to reflector XLX005U in whatever manner they use to connect to the XLX network. For YSF Fusion it would be Room 02356.

If you would like to link Slot 1 of GB3ND to Slot 1 of GB7FB for the purposes of a regional North Devon net, someone in range of each repeater should connect each in the manner above to 2365 and the repeaters will be linked. After all, they are now both using the same talkgroup. There is an inactivity disconnect time of 10mins. Don't forget to disconnect from 2356 when you have finished with a private call to 4000.

Perhaps this all sounds a little unfamiliar. Rest assured, the only slightly tricky bit is finding out how your radio makes a private call, the rest is simple.
